



**Town Hall in Poznań** - one of the most valuable monuments of the Renaissance architecture in Central Europe. Contemporary shape is due to the reconstruction done under the supervision of an Italian architect John Baptist di Quadro.

1999-2001- overall conservation, the works embraced: renovation and changing of plaster, reconstruction of drawn cornice (1100 m), conservation of stonework (635 m<sup>2</sup>), erratic (diluvial) sculpture and sgraffiti decoration, as well as painted decoration, reinforcing of the construction of the building.

Uncovering of the part of the Renaissance sgraffiti decorations, enabled its reconstruction on the elevation of the core.

Conservation of stucco and reconstruction of painted decoration on the east elevation (depicting Polish Kings from Piast nad Jagiello Dynasties).

Repair and changing of the copper covering of the roof (600 m<sup>2</sup>).

Conservation of the Gothic brick elevation on the tower (430 m<sup>2</sup>).
